Fort Lee: Cultural Resources Inventory and Management

HRA Gray & Pape provided extensive Section 110 guidance to Fort Lee environmental staff including development of an Historic Preservation Plan (HPP) for the facility. The HPP was prepared in a user-friendly format that enables Army directorates to accomplish specific tasks and missions without adversely affecting archaeological resources. Archaeological resource identification and assessment surveys included documentation of an extensive set of World War I earthworks constructed for military training. 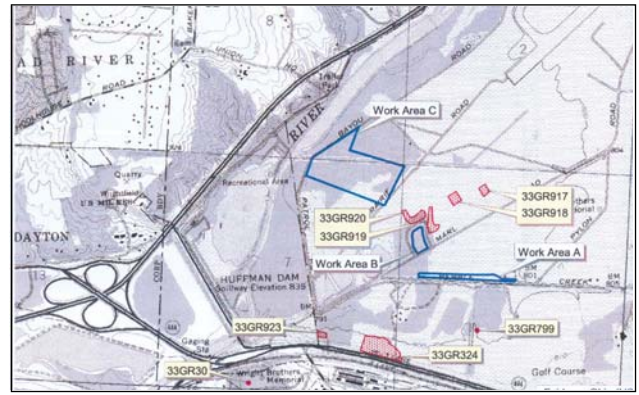


**NASA Langley Research Center, Hampton, Virginia:
Cultural Resources Management Plan**

HRA Gray & Pape prepared a cultural resources management plan to assist the NASA Langley Research Center (LaRC) in meeting their responsibilities under Section 110 of the NHPA. The plan identified processes for merging cultural resource stewardship responsibilities with mission programs under LaRC's Master Facilities Plan. The CRMP established guidelines for identifying specific cultural resource management tasks relevant to the range of LaRC's mission planning activities. Successful integration was achieved through coordination with the Facilities Program Development Office; the Office of Safety, Environmental and Mission Assurance; and other facility level divisions.

Wright-Patterson Air Force Base: Archaeological Resources Inventory of 12 Work Areas in Greene and Montgomery counties, Ohio

HRA Gray & Pape, working through USACE Louisville District, completed archaeological resource identification survey of over 300 acres across 12 work areas at WPAFB. The survey was conducted under the base-wide cultural resources management plan and focused on the archaeological verification of low probability areas across the base.
